The first list lists some books by types of books, the second list lists books by genre, and the third list is for rising First Graders, but your child may enjoy them and gain confidence by reading a book that is easy to read.

I have also included a handout which makes it simple to know if the book your child has chosen is within their reading level or not. Please note that books that are difficult to read should not be *eliminated*, only that those books are choices that would need to be read together with a parent, so you can help with difficult words and explain what is going on with the plot as needed.
